Presentation:

Todd Essig and Sherry Turkle will discuss Al and its impact on psychoanalysis, and the ethical considerations for our professional work as well as daily life, moderated by Marc Levine. Interaction and conversation with participants are encouraged.

Presenters:

Todd Essig, PhD, is Training and Supervising Psychoanalyst at the William Alanson White Institute, Adjunct Clinical Professor at the NYU PostDoc Program in Psychoanalysis, and a member of Psychotherapy Action Network (PsiAN) Advisory Board. He was co-author of the International Psychoanalytic Association (IPA) Task Force report on distance training (TF2) and for many years, until the pandemic, wrote 'Managing Mental Wealth" for *Forbes*. During the pandemic he co-chaired the American Psychoanalytic Association's (APsA) "Covid Response Team." Areas of current research interest include the gains and losses of teletherapies and how emerging technologies, especially Al, change self-experience and intimate relationships. He created and currently Co-Chairs the APsA Council on Artificial Intelligence (CAI).

Sherry Turkle is the Abby Rockefeller Mauzé Professor of the Social Studies of Science and Technology in the Program in Science, Technology, and Society at MIT, and the founding director of the MIT Initiative on Technology and Self. Professor Turkle received a joint doctorate in sociology and personality psychology from Harvard University and is a licensed clinical psychologist. Professor Turkle writes on the "subjective side" of people's relationships with technology, especially computers. She is an expert on culture and therapy, mobile technology, social networking, and sociable robotics, which is the field of designing robots to interact with people in a natural and social way. Professor Turkle is currently writing a book on people's relationships with chatbots.

Marc S. Levine, MD, is a psychiatrist and psychoanalyst and is former Director of the Institute for the Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis. Dr. Levine serves on the APsA Council on Artificial Intelligence (CAI). He is chair of a subcommittee of CAI that was formed to study and suggest guidelines for the productive and ethical use of AI in psychoanalytic practice, education, research and administration.

Who Should Attend:

The program is extended to members of the Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis. We also welcome psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, licensed counselors, mental health students, and other mental health providers who are interested in psychoanalytic theory, practice and perspectives.

The workshop will take place on Zoom in order to provide maximum accessibility.

Objectives:

Participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe the history of the relationship of AI in the field of psychoanalysis.
- 2. Describe concerns related to the use of Al in the theory of psychoanalysis.
- 3. Explain concerns related to the use of Al in the practice of psychoanalysis.
